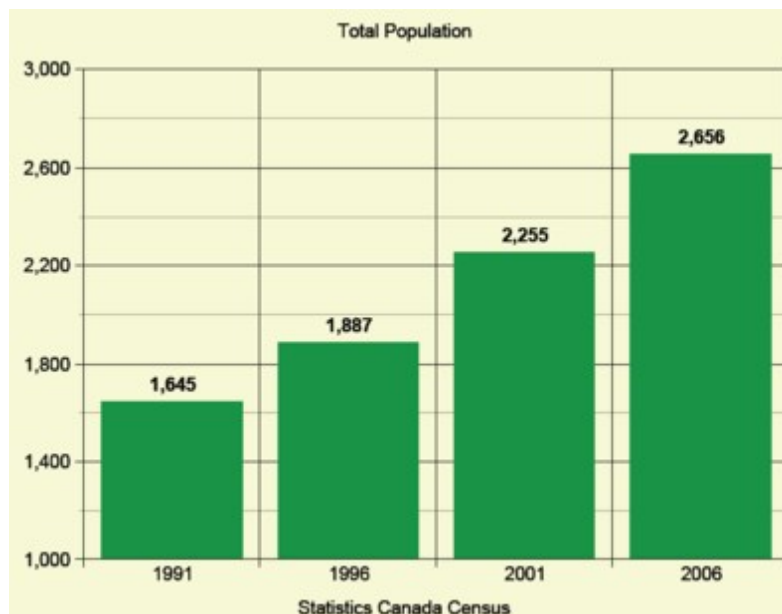


Demographics - Community

Carstairs is a growing town situated in Central Alberta, nestled between the prairies to the east and the parklands to the west, and along the Calgary/Edmonton corridor. The namesake of a town in Lanarkshire, Scotland, Carstairs started life as the centre of a ranching community, but now the area encompasses not only dairy farming and grain growing, but a very productive oil and gas sector.
