funding to continue supplying towns with clean water. Planning continues for a secondary line to the reservoirs. Infrastructure modeling is in progress with asset management and ISL. The electrical upgrade is being finalized.

CAO Blair explained that, although it is clear the school board is awaiting a formal letter from ATEC before beginning to devise a mitigation plan, the issue ultimately comes down to funding, and the board is reluctant to front the costs. Staff at HSS agree with the concerns but report to the school board.

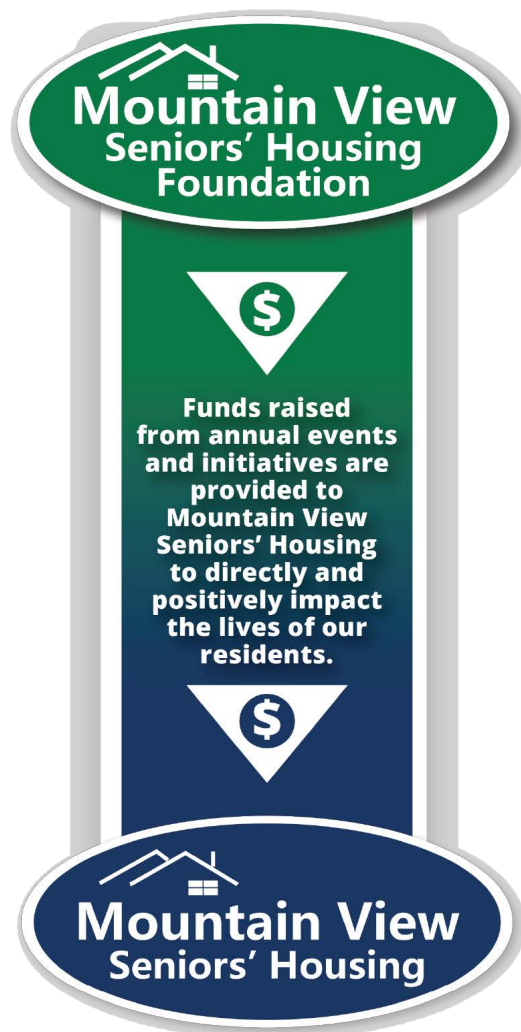


## Mountain View Seniors' Housing



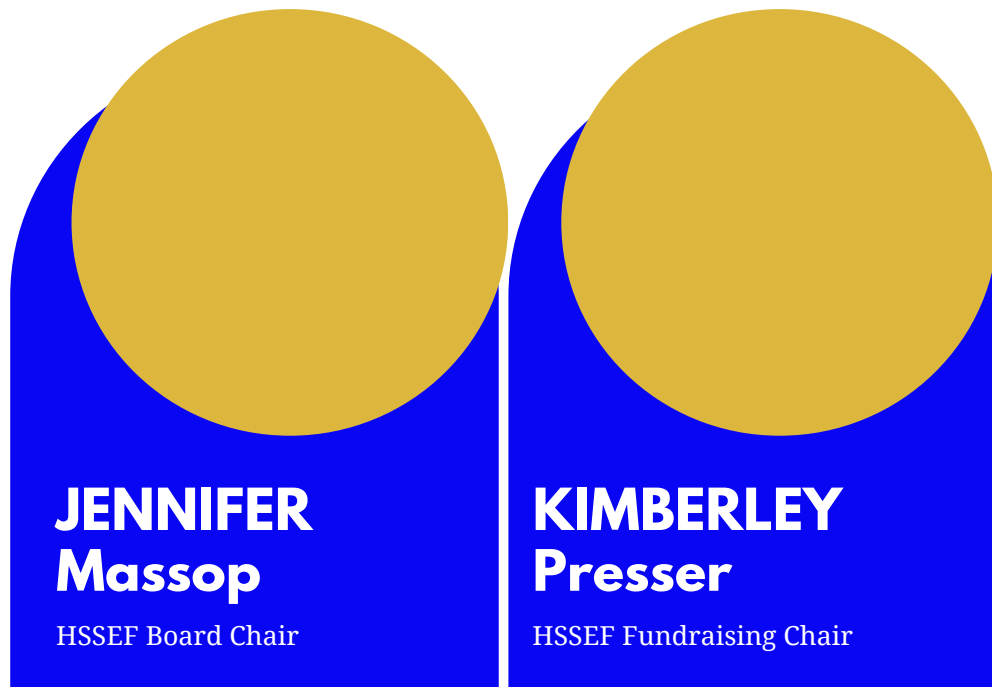
